Parish Refugee Response

The Parish Refugee Response group would like to thank you for your generosity over the last few weeks and the contributions have been steadily increasing. We are aware that many groups have been doing similar things in preperation for the incoming refugees. Like many groups, we are hoping that the inevitable processing of the refugees will not hamper peoples attempts to help. We are aware that as we wait, the reports of the situation of the refugees are telling us that their situation is worsening. We are continuing to seek ways of fulfilling our parish commitment that a family will be looked after by our response to the crisis, whether here on Irish soil, or on mainland Europe. We are in contact with the Irish Refugee Council, the Red Cross and the Donegal Justice and Peace Group to see how our help can be best apportioned.

The refugee buckets in the chapel were put in place to help those who were looking for ways to contribute to the cause. They have been manned by members of the committee to date. We do not intend this to be an ongoing collection so in the next week or two the group will no longer man the buckets, but there will be a bucket in the sacristy for anybody who wishes to keep using them for contributions.

Again, thank you for your generous response and we will keep you updated as to our progress.
