<u>PATHWAYS – An Adult Faith Development</u> <u>Programme (Raphoe Diocese)</u>

Have you ever thought about exploring your faith.....or wished that you could broaden your understanding of your faith Found yourself longing to search for some kind of deeper meaning in life? ... Perhaps you are feeling challenged by questions your children or grandchildren are asking about God and the meaning of faith for which you feel you have 'no answers' ...perhaps you are feeling challenged by all that is happening in Ireland and in the Church right now. If so, *Pathways* may be the course for you.

Pathways is a two-year, <u>one day a month</u> course for adults who wish to explore their faith (9 days each year). It runs from October to June each year. There are no exams and no written work. You can just come along and enjoy! Each day consists of input from excellent and engaging speakers and the opportunity for discussion.

The cost is €250 for the coming academic year. Booking is now open. The programme begins this year in the Parish Centre, Stranorlar on Saturday the 1st October 2015 (10:00am - 4:00pm). The Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady celebrates Marv's entry into heaven. In Irish, it is called Lá Fhéile Naomh Muire san Fhómhar. that is. "The Feast Day of Our Lady in the Harvest *Time*^{*}. This theme is expressed in the liturgy of the day. The core of Catholic faith is expressed in the Preface of the Mass for Solemnity of the Assumption: 'Today the virgin Mother of God was taken up into heaven to be the beginning and the pattern of the Church in its perfection. and a sign of hope and comfort for your people on their way. You would not allow decay to touch her body, for she had given birth to your Son, the Lord of all life, in the glory of the incarnation.' Traditional Irish piety saw Mary as Queen of the Harvest. Like her son Jesus, she is a kind of "first-fruits" and we, the faithful, hopefully, are the rest of the harvest. Patrick Kavanagh gives beautiful expression to how he hoped to participate in this harvest in one of his early poems, entitled I May Reap. I who have not sown. I too By God's grace may come to harvest And proud As the bowed Reapers At the Assumption Murmur thanksgiving. Until recently, in Ireland and England, traditional pilgrimages to holy wells (Lady's Well) took place on this day.
