Study of Godparenthood

My name is Bernadette Sweetman and I am studving for a Professional Doctorate in Education. My area of research is godparenthood. Today, the first Sunday of Lent, we remember Saint Peter and celebrate the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter and his papacy in Rome. Like us all, Peter was not without faults. He was reproached several times by Christ in the Gospels, as well as falling asleep in the garden of Getsemani and also denving Christ three times following his Parrest. After the death and resurrection of Jesus, Peter spread the message of Christ as far away as Judea and Syria, eventually settling in Rome. As foretold by Jesus, he suffered a martyrs death on Vatican Hill, choosing to be crucified upside-down because he viewed himself as a sinner and unworthy of a similar death to Christ.
