youth group, Grandparents, Couples, etc.?

You may be aware that there was no Ecumenical service this year. The Church of Ireland is currently dealing with a shortage of Ministers. It would be wrong to think that this is something that we do not have to worry about, or that it is something we can deal with further down the line. The time to reassess our situation is now. We need to prepare for 'priestless parishes'. We have already seen our parish drop from three

priests to two, (including the Arranmore curate). It didn't seem to affect us as almost immediately, Fr. Matt McInerney took over, and for 12 years has been a great benefit and help to us in our services.

Fr. Matt has thought that on his 80th birthday, it is time officially retire from this service. Not so much because he couldn't continue, rather he thinks that it gives the illusion that all is ok, that there will always be a priest to step in & that there will be business as usual.

There is little hope of a replacement priest in the near future. In fact, most parishes are preparing for the future, which involves lay people running parishes, and visiting priests to provide the sacraments and the like.

In our parish, I have spoken about the need to rationalize Masses, to reconsider times and availability of Masses. It is my intention to continue to offer Mass in Acres on Mondays and Thursdays, and in Kincasslagh on Wednesdays and Fridays.

Regarding the weekend, it is no longer necessary to have four Masses. Indeed, for one priest, Canon Law prohibits it. In light of that, we have been carefully watching the attendance of each Mass and it has been obvious that Kincasslagh Mass on a Saturday evening is the least attended. Many people in the Kincasslagh area also now go to Acres Mass, as there is no brae to contend with on the way in or out. Coupled with he fact that I often have weddings and baptisms on Saturdays, it seems practical that the parish continues with one vigil Mass on Saturdays, at 6.00 p.m. in Acres. and two Masses on Sunday. one in each Chapel. I would also feel it necessary to have at least an hour and a half between Masses on Sunday, as getting from one service to the other can be a bit of a squeeze with only one hour to finish Mass, take bookings for Masses and other things people may want, drive to the other chapel and begin the Mass there. So I believe we should also look at the Mass times on Sunday, to make it more serviceable. With this in mind, I would like to call a meeting with parishioners to hear your views. If you have a suggestion or a point of view. I would like you to come to a meeting on Saturday 4th February in St. Mary's Hall to share it as we try to begin the process of rationalization.
