After coming back from a walk in the grounds, he came in to find her on her knees, putting a final sheen on her waxing job. He laughingly teased her: "You work too much!" The nun straightened up, still kneeling, and looked at him sternly, bordering on severity, and said, "Heaven isn't cheap, you know!"

The priest concluded that more than likely she was educated to believe that life was supposed to be an ordeal, the price of eternal bliss, that heaven must be bought and it is not cheap.

Do you believe goodness will secure your place in heaven someday? Many good, honest people believe God tends to favour people when they are "good". Thank goodness, the Bible says God's love is not dependent upon my actions. It is 100 percent a gift.
