"Irish Water Safety" will carry out **Swimming Lessons** and **Safety & Rescue training** in the Keadue and Cruit areas on week beginning **10th August.**

Swim lessons will take place at The block yard beach in Keadue from 12.30 – 2.30 each day and are suitable for children aged from 4 upwards. Registration will take place from 12 on Monday 10th Aug

The Feast of the Assumption

Saturday is the Feast of the Assumption. As Catholics are obliged to acknowledge this feast, there will be a vigil Mass in St. Mary's on Friday evening and a Mass in St. Columba's on Saturday morning.

The commemoration of the death of the Blessed Virgin Mary (the Dormition, or falling asleep, as it was known in the East) is known as the Assumption because of the tradition that her body did not decay but that she was raised up, body and soul, into heaven. This tradition was already present in the sixth century; by the beginning of the twentieth century it was widespread; and after consulting the views of bishops all over the world, the Pope formally and infallibly declared the doctrine of the Assumption to be part of the authentic and ancient doctrine of the universal Church.

It is one of the very rare occasions that a Pope has invoked infallibility on a doctrine. Much misunderstood among Catholics and the world alike, it is only when the Pope pronounces infallibility that what he proclaims is considered irrevocable by the Church. At all other times, he or his successor hold the right to change his opinion.
