Reopening our Churches

It was with some relief that we heard on Friday that our lockdown was coming to an end, and specifically for the Church, that we are able to open once again from the 10th of May to congregations of 50 people, for Mass, and for weddings and Funerals.

Almost instantly the question of noncompliance in Donegal found us looking at an exceptional extension of lockdown limitations here.

This is very disappointing, especially as so many people have been more than compliant over this period, and that in the Glenties electoral area until recently our figures were much lower than the national average. It also shows that we can turn that around by being extra vigilant and careful over the next week or so. Dr. Holohan has challenged us to respond in a healthy way to this observation, giving us the opportunity and challenge to flatten the numbers here in Donegal.

So it will be next week before we can determine if we are to open our doors for Mass once again. If we do, we need to re-introduce ushers to the services to assist

people with sanitization and mask wearing. I will contact the experienced ushers by WhatsApp if anybody feels that they can lend a hand, that would be much appreciated. Teams cleaning and sanitising the chapel have been working away and this has been a great service to our community. Again, we look for any new volunteers to help with this process. I find the change from being closed to being open a difficult, stressful one, but I know that within a short time it becomes the norm. It is lovely to see people in front of you at Mass, but like many of us, there is a need to adjust

So if we are released from Lockdown Jail on Monday week, let's do so safely and with great consideration for what it may mean to each individual.
