Masses in our Parish

We are still in a situation of pandemic and this should be reflected in our religious practices. Remember,

1. the obligation to attend Mass is still lifted from us.

2. Any Mass during the week can be considered our Sabbath Mass. Consider leaving weekend Masses to those who cannot go during the week if you can attend during the week. There is one less Mass at weekends again.

 Months mind Masses and first anniversaries should be left for family and close friends.
 Confessions are available upon request after

each Mass, except Sunday.

5. If you have travelled from another country and are supposed to be isolating, please do not come to chapel, but feel free to join us online at MCNMEDIA.TV or on Facebook at Kincasslagh Parish.

First Holy Communion

If your child is waiting for First Holy Communion, bring them along to a weekly Masses in the meantime to familiarise them with the practice and the prayers of Mass, and the sense of belonaina to a Christian community. First Communion is not a once off Sacrament, rather it is the beginning of your child's ability to understand the difference between bread and the Body of Christ, and therefore to receive the Holy Gift in their lives. With regular participation, there is no reason a child who is attending Mass habitually cannot begin to receive with the rest of the community after confession and without the 'big day'! I propose that those who wish to begin the practice of receiving Holy Communion take a card from the sacristy. When a child attends Mass, Fr. Matt or I will sign the card and date the attendance of the child. When a child has completed seven attendances, Sundays or weekdays during the summer, we can arrange a first confession after which the child can come to Mass and receive with the rest of the faithful. They can still participate in the celebration in September along with their classmates.

Unfortunately Baptisms have now been included in the sacraments we cannot dispense in these days. I will however honour the baptisms that have been booked already, but with 6 present, parents, godparents, the infant and the priest.
