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Jesus could have eradicated evil from our world: he could have annihilated his enemies. It is a mystery to us that he chose another way. He endured all that the world threw at him, and responded to it with great love, and so he helps us cope with our misery. Though that is admirable, however, it is not enough. So in warning his disciples about his passion, note that he always adds in his resurrection. In the gospels, there is no passion without resurrection. Suffering and death are linked solidly to life after death. The two are opposite sides of the one coin. Evil plays out its role and is finally encompassed by eternal life and

conquers all.

As they make their way to Jerusalem with Jesus, the disciples fail to understand that betrayal and death awaits him there. A Messiah who suffers is obviously not on their radar.

Jesus comes amona us to show us how to love. He showed that love even to the end. Recall your experiences of loving in vour own life and a time when your loving made demands on you. What kinds of feelings does this memory evoke for you? Talk to Jesus about those feelings. Lord, when suffering or betraval come my way, let me offer them lovingly to you. Let me believe that my unavoidable sufferings, patiently and lovingly endured, play their part in the saving of the world.
