Envelopes for 2022

Please take a box of envelopes from the exits of the chapel as you leave this weekend. They include the Sunday Collections, and some others such as Gravevard Collection. Peters Pence, Trocaire, Mission Sunday, Christmas gift to priest, Emigrants collection, Holy Places, etc. Each envelope is numbered so that your contribution can, if so wished, be registered. The number you get is random, so you decide whether or not your contribution is anonymous or recorded. If you put your name on the first one or two envelopes of the new packet, it will be recorded separately from the book that records the contributions. Even if you decide not to give your name and donate anonymously, we will still have a record of the contributions associated with that box number. should you ever need it, and of course can show that you have the box of remaining envelopes.

Thank you for your continued contributions over the disruptions during the pandemic, you have certainly supported your church generously even when our doors were closed. Thank you to the online community for their most generous contributions through PayPal, and through the Diocesan Website and to all who contributed to St. Columba's Gutters fundraiser last year.
