Market/Bargain Rail

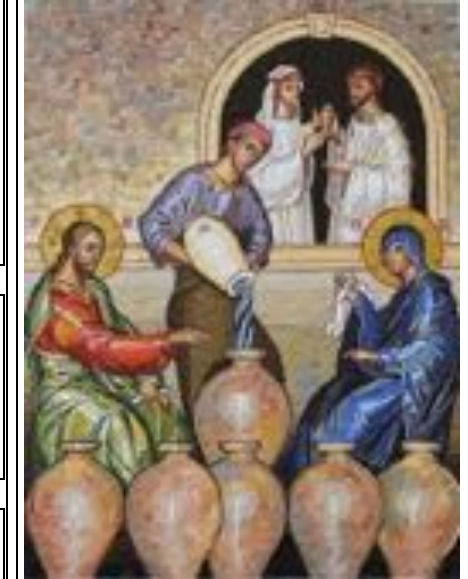

The Marriage at Cana



Marriage is a sacrament, a sign that also contains what it signifies. The Catechism explains: *On the threshold of his public life Jesus performs his first sign—at his mother's request—during a wedding feast. The Church attaches great importance to Jesus' presence at the wedding at Cana. She sees in it the confirmation of the goodness of marriage and the proclamation that thenceforth marriage will be an efficacious sign of Christ's presence.* CCC, 1613
The Catechism further explains... *The entire Christian life bears the mark of the spousal love of Christ and the Church ... Christian marriage in its turn becomes an efficacious sign, the sacrament of the covenant of Christ and the Church. Since it signifies and communicates grace, marriage between baptized persons is a true sacrament of the New Covenant.* CCC, 1617
