Easter story reimagined live!

Derry-Londonderry, April 14-16 2022

Derry's famous city walls are the dramatic backdrop for Walled City Passion — a unique livestreamed performance festival for the whole city to enjoy and participate in this Easter.

In this dynamic reimagining of the Easter story, a Peace Festival celebrating society's re-emergence from the pandemic is disrupted by news of an evolving security situation. As word spreads through rolling news and social media, events threaten to throw not just the city, but the world, into turmoil.

Walled City Passion will be staged as part of a three-day civic festival on Thursday - Saturday (April 14 - 16). Performances, at 12.30 pm and 4.30pm daily, will be broadcast on a 'big screen' in Guildhall Square and streamed on social media channels. The 4.30 pm performance on Good Friday will be streamed live on the RTÉ and BBC players, and RTÉ One will televise a one-hour special of *Walled City Passion* at 10.30 on Easter Sunday night. The Social Buddies programme is a befriending Service which matches volunteers with ID Day service users for leisure purposes. The aim of the programme is to enhance the lives of individuals with intellectual disability by providing flexible social supports outside the 9-5-day service hours and are not readily available within traditional ID Day services to attend leisure activities in their community and online. The program will also include section 38/39, and private organisations who work with people with intellectual disability. The programme uses a person-centred approach where service users can pursue an activity of their choice in their own community or online. Participants are matched with volunteers based on common interests, age and location with the view to developing social connections for individuals using the HSE day services outside of service settings. Linking with volunteers gives service

users direct access to the wider community and improves social outcomes for service users who wish to take part in social activity in their community or online. Outings may cover a range of social activities such as going for coffee, participating in sport, and leisure - swimming, art, craft, cinema and more. Participants in the programme will be supported by the social Buddies coordinator until the service user and volunteer feel comfortable to continue the activity on their own.

E-Social Buddies is an online version of the social buddies' programme where day service users can connect with friends and meet new people. Participants meet in small groups doing fun activities online. This may include teatime chats, music sessions, dancing and much more. Activities are supported by volunteers. Volunteers and service users are matched up by their shared interests. The programme is a GENIO funded initiative and is part of the Service Reform programme funding (SRF) which is being developed between HSE CHO1 and Spraoi agus Sport. Guided by co design principles that will assist individuals with intellectual difficulties to create a more satisfying and fulfilling social life in their own locality and online.
