

The Raphoe Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes 2024 will depart from The City of Derry Airport on Monday 27th May for 4 nights. The Pilgrimage will be led by Most Reverend Bishop Alan McGuckian, SJ, with Pilgrimage Director, Fr Stephen Gorman. The cost of the Pilgrimage is €835 per person in the Agena Hotel or €879 per person in the Panorama Hotel. This includes direct return flights from City of Derry Airport to Lourdes, full religious programme, all

airport transfers, taxes and Sanctuary Levy, four nights' accommodation in selected hotel, with breakfast, lunch and dinner each day. There is a single room supplement of €39 per night. All bookings should be made through Joe Walsh Tours DIRECTLY on 01 2410800.

International Day of Clean Energy

The International Day of Clean Energy will be on Friday the 26th January. This is a day to remind our collective use of energy and to be mindful and aware of how we consume and use energy. Physics informs us energy cannot be created or destroyed but it can be transformed from one form into another. To ensure health and wellbeing for ourselves and the biodiverse environment, we need to consume forms of energy and transform them into forms of energy that promote and ensure continued health and wellbeing for all on Earth. Such forms of energy are Clean Energies and on the International Day of Clean Energy, these are celebrated for replacing unclean forms of energy that are multiplying pollution in the Earth's atmosphere, in the oceans, in the soils and in our bodies. Clean energies are formed when cycling, walking, growing food in our own gardens and consuming food grown locally while forms of energies from unhealthy carbon emitting technologies are minimised by the use of solar panels, wind turbines, hydro power, biogas combined heat and power and electric powered transport systems. The UN Sustainable Development Goal No 7(SDG-7) calls for ensuring access to such affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all. The Energy Progress Report for 2023 that tracks progress towards the SDG-7 goals reports 675 million people around the world in 2021 didn't have access to electricity down from 1.1 billion in 2010, 2.3 billion people in 2021 didn't have access to clean cooking down from 2.9 billion in 2010 and 19.1% of consumed energy globally in 2020 was sourced from renewables, up from 16% in 2010. These trends are positive and need to improve further by contributing to the global effort to transition to technologies that transform clean forms of energy to other clean forms of energy.
